**INTRODUCTION**

*Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of Lent with ash on our foreheads. This cross echoes our baptismal anointing, when we were buried with Christ. The ash is a chilling reminder of our mortality, but because our death is now in Christ, our endings are beginnings. The Lenten disciplines of acts of kindness, prayer, and fasting are tools of discipleship that can lead us to renewal as we bury all that is holding us back from being truly alive.*

**READING**

Psalm 51

Have mercy on me, O God, according to your steadfast love; according to your abundant mercy blot out my transgressions.

**<sup>2</sup> Wash me thoroughly from my iniquity, and cleanse me from my sin.**

<sup>3</sup> For I know my transgressions, and my sin is ever before me.

**<sup>4</sup> Against you, you alone, have I sinned, and done what is evil in your sight, so that you are justified in your sentence and blameless when you pass judgment.**

<sup>5</sup> Indeed, I was born guilty, a sinner when my mother conceived me.

**<sup>6</sup> You desire truth in the inward being; therefore teach me wisdom in my secret heart.**

<sup>7</sup> Purge me with hyssop, and I shall be clean; wash me, and I shall be whiter than snow.

**<sup>8</sup> Let me hear joy and gladness; let the bones that you have crushed rejoice.**

<sup>9</sup> Hide your face from my sins, and blot out all my iniquities.

**<sup>10</sup> Create in me a clean heart, O God, and put a new and right spirit within me.**

<sup>11</sup> Do not cast me away from your presence, and do not take your holy spirit from me.

**<sup>12</sup> Restore to me the joy of your salvation, and sustain in me a willing spirit.**

<sup>13</sup> Then I will teach transgressors your ways, and sinners will return to you.

<sup>14</sup> **Deliver me from bloodshed, O God, O God of my salvation, and my tongue will sing aloud of your deliverance.**

<sup>15</sup> O LORD, open my lips, and my mouth will declare your praise.

<sup>16</sup> **For you have no delight in sacrifice; if I were to give a burnt offering, you would not be pleased.**

<sup>17</sup> The sacrifice acceptable to God is a broken spirit; a broken and contrite heart, O God, you will not despise.

<sup>18</sup> **Do good to Zion in your good pleasure; rebuild the walls of Jerusalem,**

<sup>19</sup> then you will delight in right sacrifices, in burnt offerings and whole burnt offerings; then bulls will be offered on your altar.

We are treated as impostors, and yet are true; <sup>9</sup> as unknown, and yet are well known; as dying, and see — we are alive; as punished, and yet not killed; <sup>10</sup> as sorrowful, yet always rejoicing; as poor, yet making many rich; as having nothing, and yet possessing everything.

## INVITATION TO LENT

### CONFESSION OF SIN

Let us confess our sin in the presence of God and of one another.

*Silence is kept for reflection and self-examination.*

Most holy and merciful God,

**Have mercy on us, O God.**

Our false judgments, our uncharitable thoughts toward our neighbors, and our prejudice and contempt toward those who differ from us, we confess to you.

**Have mercy on us, O God.**

Our waste and pollution of your creation, and our lack of concern for those who come after us, we confess to you.

**Have mercy on us, O God.**

Restore us, O God, and let your anger depart from us.

**Hear us, O God, for your mercy is great.**

Receive these prayers and all that we fail to ask, O God, for the sake of Jesus Christ who restores us to life.



## Ash Wednesday

*On this solemn first day of Lent, we are reminded of our deep need for God's mercy and forgiveness. We are no different than Israel, David, the Corinthians, or the disciples. We all fall short of God's standards and need Jesus to reconcile us to the Father. Even our piety is tainted by sin as we practice prayer, giving, and serving with ill motives. We, like David, cry, "Create in me a clean heart, O God. Renew in me a right spirit. Cast me not away from your presence."*

### **First Lesson: Joel 2:12-19**

### **Return to Me!**

The Lord called his people to return to him with all their hearts. Instead of tearing their clothing in repentance and sorrow, he urged them to rend their hearts. The God of Israel requires nothing less than his children's undivided devotion. When the neighboring nations thought God had abandoned his people, the Lord had pity on them and came to their aid.

### **Psalm 51**

### **Create in Me a Clean Heart**

David cried to the Lord for mercy in the face of sinful behavior with another man's wife. His lust and idolatry of his own power got the best of him, and he took what he wanted even though it did not belong to him. When he recognized the wickedness of his ways, he repented and asked God for a new and upright heart.

### **2 Corinthians 5:20b — 6:10**

### **Be Reconciled to God**

Paul explained to the believers in Corinth that as Christ followers, they were called to be ambassadors for Christ, representing him wherever they went and working for reconciliation among all people. This would require great endurance and strength, and yet through it all, God would guide them in their kingdom work.

### **Matthew 6:1-6, 16-21**

### **Practice Piety in Secret**

Jesus instructed his disciples in the ways in which they practiced prayer and generosity. They were not to broadcast it around town; instead, they were to keep it quiet so that their reward came from God and not from any man's praise.
